Superintendent's Message

Happy New Year! I am excited to welcome in 2015 which I trust will be a wonderful year for Greene CSD. I hope everyone had a wonderful Christmas and holiday break and is rested and excited about the start of the new year.

The development of the 2015-2016 budget has begun. We remain hopeful that recent signs of economic growth here in NY State will translate to improvements in state funding for our school. We are hard at work with early budget discussions and planning while eagerly awaiting the Governor's proposal and subsequent response by our legislature.

Reduced funding over the past five years has necessitated significant spending reductions that have affected almost all aspects of our programming. We are hopeful that this year we will see funding replenished which will allow us to revisit reductions in staffing and programming and begin to make adjustments that will further our charge as expressed in our mission statement.

Planning is well under way for our 6.4 million dollar capital project. Phase One plans are under review at the State Education Department. Approval is expected within the month and work will be scheduled to begin over the summer. The scope of Phase One work will be focused on general construction and will include roof repairs, concrete and brick work. This work will take place over the summer and should not impact students or staff.

We are currently working through the details of our Main Project which will go to State Education in early Spring. The scope of this work will be more involved, encompassing systems upgrades, renovations and the associated mechanical components. We anticipate most of this work being done over the summer of 2016 and once again it should not impact students or staff. Thank you again, for your support of this capital project and our efforts to maintain our facilities and in turn provide our children with the best possible environment and instructional program possible.

As we approach the midpoint of the 2014-2015 school year it is an opportune time to reflect on our progress to date. The first half of this school year has been very smooth. Instructionally we are still adjusting to changes associated with the Common Core Learning Standards and other initiatives pushed by both Albany and the Federal Government. Change and innovation, though, are common in our profession as we constantly wrestle with changes in curricula, technology,

pedagogy and our understanding of best instructional practices. Clearly our faculty, staff and administration are committed to their practice as is evidenced by recent recognition by Business First for the 2013-2014 school year.

Over the past two years, Greene was ranked 4th of 40 Binghamton area schools. This year Greene was ranked as the 3rd highest performing school in our region. Additionally, for the second year in a row Greene was ranked as one of the top (#3) overachieving schools of 429 schools in upstate NY! This recognition is a reflection on the program we provide our children and more importantly the quality of instruction they receive.

We have much to be proud of here in Greene. The faculty, staff, administration and Board of Education are committed to our mission to "inspire students to learn the skills and behaviors necessary to become productive citizens." We are deeply committed to providing quality programing as well as safe and quality facilities which will enhance programing for our students and community. We continue to strive to provide effective communication with all members of our community that will maximize our ability to meet our responsibilities. Last but not least we are dedicated to our responsibility to ensuring the District's long-term fiscal stability and health which allows us to meet our responsibilities to our children. We are very proud of our successes and accomplishments but we continue to strive to improve and do better each and every day.
