Superintendent's Message

The start of the New Year offers a valuable chance to both reflect on the accomplishments of the past year and to look ahead to the challenges and opportunities that await. The challenges facing schools across New York State have only strengthened our resolve to improve the programming we offer our children. Faculty and staff are working together to adapt to the implementation of the Common Core Learning Standards, we continue to reflect on current programs and practices, strengthen our use of instructional technology and challenge our professional practice.

Thank you for your patience and flexibility with the recent changes to the school calendar. On January 17, Greene CSD had an opportunity to participate in a BOCES wide presentation featuring Dr. Bill Daggett, CEO of the International Center for Leadership in Education. Dr. Daggett, an internationally known speaker on the subject of school change, presented to an audience of close to 700 educators from the Northern side of the DCMO BOCES on the topic Preparing Students to be College and Career Ready. Dr. Daggett recognized the strengths of the U.S. public education system then clearly articulated why schools need to change and initiated a discussion on what schools can do to ensure we graduate students who are both college and career ready. We now have a wonderful opportunity to work with Dr. Daggett and his leadership team to continue this discussion and begin to formulate a plan to ensure our graduates are prepared for the 21st Century. Dr. Daggett's message was overwhelmingly well received by our Greene faculty which is a testament to their professionalism and dedication.

The budget development process is in full swing. Based on the governor's initial budget proposal, Greene is slated to receive an aid increase of just a little more than \$160,000. While his proposed budget included additional monies for

Universal Pre-Kindergarten, technology and bonuses for highly effective teachers, it failed to adequately address the immediate and fundamental funding deficiencies plaguing schools in the form of the Gap Elimination Adjustment.

The challenges and implications of the reduction in education aid are significant and over the past four years, amount to a loss of \$5.9 million in education aid. This funding deficiency has necessitated a reduction in staff of close to 20%, more than \$2.8 million in spending reductions and the use of close to \$2.7 million from reserves over the past four years. Last year's budget alone required the use of \$660,000 from district reserves. This means that as we start the 2014-2015 budget development process, if all spending stayed the same, we begin with a deficit of \$660,000. As you know, cost of living and other cost increases are inevitable so this position is clearly exacerbated.

This minimal aid increase, when coupled with the tax levy cap, does not provide Greene CSD with the revenue needed to meet basic costs. The budget committee of our Board of Education and I are working carefully with the administrative team to craft a responsible budget that balances these funding challenges with our obligation to provide our children with an educational program.

In these trying and very difficult times, I am reminded daily of why I do what I do . . . it is about our kids. Our children come to us with tremendous potential—potential demonstrated every day and in countless ways. Our faculty and staff are dedicated to our children and to their profession that, to put it simply, is about making a positive difference in the lives of others. We will weather the fiscal challenges and adjust to all the other changes being thrust on us and we will continue to provide a quality educational program that truly does produce college and career ready students.

This year we would like to purchase two (2) 65 passenger propane buses and one (1) micro propane bus, at a cost not to exceed \$298,383.

Greene Dollars for Scholars Re-branding as Greene Community Scholarship Fund



In December, 2000, a few dedicated members of our community began the Greene Chapter of Dollars for Scholars. This program was established through Scholarship America. At the time, there were multiple benefits of aligning ourselves with Scholarship America, including the opportunity for graduating seniors to double their scholarship opportunities through partnering colleges and universities. Over the years, the benefits of being part of this larger organization have diminished for the students and the responsibilities of our membership to the board have increased exponentially.

As such, we have made the decision as an organization to realign and re-brand. We will now be partnering with the Community Foundation for South Central New York and from here forward will be known as the Greene Community Scholarship Fund, a component fund of the Foundation. The mission of the Community Foundation is to "offer caring individuals an effective way to endow their community in a manner that is responsible, responsive and lasting." Their mission statement and position in our community to be steward of leadership and resources to the Greene Community Scholarship Fund board is complementary to our goals.

Over the next couple of months we will be providing more information to community members as we develop into our new name. Our goal will remain the same—to provide as many scholarships as possible to graduating seniors of Greene Central High School, to help assist in their pursuit of college or trade school education, and to offer non-traditional scholarship opportunities to adults seeking continuing education. We will also continue to host the Annual Golf-Ball Drop Homecoming Weekend each year, as one of our primary fundraisers.
