Wednesday, March 25, Greene Central School hosted the Regional SUNY Broome Robotic Competition. The competition was sponsored by Raymond. Nine area schools brought a total of 92 students to compete in one of four robotic events.

The competition consisted of four

events, the Head to Head Event, the Remote Control Forklift Event, the Line Follow Event, and the Autonomous Event. The Remote Control Forklift Event was created by the Robotic Committee in honor of the main sponsor of the entire completion, Raymond Corporation. Some events had 28 teams entered to compete. The competition this year was higher than previous years.

Greene took 1st place in the Autonomous Event. The team leader for that event was **Liam Allport**, a senior at GCS. In the Head to Head event with 28 teams, Greene placed 7th. In the Remote Forklift Event, Greene just fell short of making the podium by only a couple of seconds.

The turnout of schools and students made for a great competition. The event was made possible by the support of

Raymond. Raymond provided t-shirts, goodie-bags, lunch, and judges. Many Raymond engineers took time to judge the different events. THANK YOU to our supporters at the RAYMOND Corporation.

SUNY Broome ran the event keeping track of scores and teams. SUNY Broome also brought college engineers to judge events and helped to keep the event organized. Overall the high school students got to interact with future engineers as well as engineers working at Raymond. This interaction helps to foster excitement in the high school students to want to take on a STEM related career.
