These influential figures choose their positions on the issues based on many different criteria including constituency, their upbringing and their political affiliation. Step #3 – Attain the following information for each slide of your PPT presentation:

Slide #1 - must include a picture, your figures **full name**, and his/her **current &/or most recent office/position**

Slide #2 – must include background information: date and place of birth, where they grew up, schooling (HS and college)

Slide #3 – must include the type(s) of jobs that they have held: **profession** (lawyer, doctor, teacher, business owner, housewife, politician, campaign worker, etc.)

Slide #4 – must include their political history – **political jobs or offices held along with the dates** (this will hopefully show the path they have taken to today) – **include Committees** that they are/were on if they serve or have served in the House &/or Senate, **if applicable**.

Slide #5 – must include their **involvement in a public policy issue(s)** and highlight those in which they may play an important role (include their role as well). If there are many then you should pick out the most important.

Slide #6 – include a slide indicating the source(s) of your information (including images/pictures) in your works cited using APA formatting.

*YOU MAY INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF SLIDES IF YOU FIND YOU HAVE A GOOD AMOUNT OF INFORMATION THAT YOU BELIEVE IS RELEVANT – <u>KEEP INFORMATION PER SLIDE AS BRIEF AS POSSIBLE</u>

Step #4 – Be prepared to share the following PowerPoints to the class in an organized and knowledgeable manner without relying too heavily on the actual presentation.
