- Michael Frieje, a student, addressed the Board regarding the cool temperature in the middle/high school. He stated that it is uncomfortably cool, which has students constantly leaving classes to get jackets.
- President Day stated that the Board would take his comments under advisement and refer the matter to the appropriate board committee.

REPORT(S): WINTER ATHLETIC **REPORT - BRYAN AYRES**

- Bryan Ayres, Director of PE & Athletics, stated that the winter sports teams have completed their seasons and because he did not receive all the End of the Season Reports until recently, he suggested giving the Board time to read through the reports and he would address any of their questions/concerns at the March 15th meeting. He also stated that JV and Varsity Spring sports begin on Monday, March 6th.

SCOTT YOUNGS

- Board member Youngs stated that the season had fewer issues than previous seasons.

INTERMEDIATE **SCHOOL REPORT**

- Bryan Ayres, Intermediate School Principal, reported on the following Intermediate School activities:
 - Character Education Jared Campbell performed and his songs and message reinforced character education themes.
 - Collecting pet supplies for a local organization "Every Dog's Dream". This ties into the February theme of caring/gratitude.
 - The Board viewed a video made by the Intermediate students and staff which was a fun way to improve a LINKS goal of making connections.
 - RTI Update Continuing scheduled grade level meetings to discuss student achievement and supports. Guidance staff attending these meetings has been a big help addressing family supports, behavior and counseling.
 - Safety and Security Recently practiced a "shelter in place" drill and then an evacuation to an off-campus site (actually just walked around the block rather than cross Route 206 to the Catholic Church).
 - District Library Funding Rural Schools Grant allowed \$1250 for each library to purchase books/materials. Carryover money was split evenly between buildings -Intermediate received approximately \$4,000 to replace damaged books and purchase new books.

- Technology Ongoing project since 2012 to bring technology to our gymnasium and PE classes which would include in part a TV monitor and sound bar. It is hoped that Greene can pilot the technology and then expand it into other buildings. PE staff, Sunnie Williams and Ryan Starliper, have been attending conferences focusing on the use of technology. Funding is a concern and possible sources are being discussed as the costs are estimated at \$9,000 -\$10,000.
- Ryan Starliper, PE teacher, explained the 21st century skills that the new technology would allow which included visual skills, student interaction, videotaping and playback, grading rubrics, health and wellness activities as well as the possibility of integration of other disciplines into PE lessons.

BUDGET COMMITTEE UPDATE:

- While the Budget Committee did not meet this past week, Mark Rubitski, Business Manager, gave the Board an update of where the process stands right now. The BOCES budget should be out on March 13th and hoping for additional aid when the State budget is adopted. He figured the property tax cap at 1.27% which is very close to the CPI. The Budget Committee will review the overall budget, including some additional budget items which may be added and then make a recommendation to the entire Board. The budget gap at the present time is \$895,583.
- Board member McCauley stated that she will be out of town for the next Budget Committee meeting on March 8th, so another Board member can attend. She also stated that she would like to see the district work the budget from the teaching needs up.
- Mark Rubitski, Business Manager, shared information received BTD HEALTH INS. from a recent Health Insurance Consortium meeting. The information covered the first 6 months of the 2016-17 year. Hospital and surgery costs are driving increases, but overall costs are trending below target and that has resulted in lower rates. Budget increases for the next three years are proposed as 5.85%. 7% and 7 ½ %. Premium wise, Greene falls in the middle in a comparison with all other consortium districts. Because Greene's rate modifier is lower, our rate was below the proposed 5.85%.
