POLICY 56.1 SCHOOL SPORTS – Uniform Policy

The official school colors of the Greene Central School District are: Dark Green, Gold and White.

All teams representing Greene Central School should make every effort to include these colors on team uniforms and athletic apparel. The District authorizes the additional color of black to be utilized in sports uniforms when the particular sport causes excessive staining to garments. (One example would be football pants.) The remainder of the uniform should adhere to the color policy. Any special colors should be approved by the Athletic Director.

Additionally, The Greene Central School official mascot is the Trojan. The Trojan emblem used on uniforms and athletic apparel should be the same as, or as similar to, as practicable, the logo featured below.

POLICY 47.1

OPIOID OVERDOSE PREVENTION

In an effort to ensure the health and safety of its students and staff, the District will maintain and administer an opioid antagonist in its schools, specifically Naloxone, otherwise known by its brand name Narcan, for use during emergencies to any student or staff member experiencing a known or suspected opioid overdose regardless of a previous history of opioid abuse.

The District has registered with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) to become a Registered Opioid Overdose Prevention Program. In addition to the school nurse, the District will permit volunteer, unlicensed school personnel who have received the requisite NYSDOH- approved training to administer Naloxone on-site during the school day and/or at any school sponsored activity occurring on-site. While school nurses may administer intramuscular [IM] or intranasal [IN] Naloxone in the event of a known or suspected opioid overdose, trained staff members may only administer intranasal [IN] Naloxone. As the District is a Registered Opioid Prevention Program, it will receive its opioid overdose kits at no cost. The medical director (school physician) will be notified whenever Naloxone is administered on-site. In accordance with relevant New York State Education Department guidance, the District will also maintain a log of trained school personnel and report newly trained personnel on a quarterly basis to the NYSDOH.
