

In Case of Bad Weather - GCS Closing Policy

Adverse weather and/or road conditions may cause school closings or delays. Often, a two-hour delay for our buses will allow road crews enough time to sand or clear roads and provide a much safer transportation situation.

Parents should be advised that our bus drivers are instructed to not travel on any road that appears to be in hazardous conditions. Therefore, even when school is in session, isolated groups of students may not receive bus transportation. Parents are asked to please be extremely cautious when having young students exposed to the cold or wind for lengthy periods of time. Parents, please have your children dress properly for the weather. Example: Coats, boots, and gloves. In the event of a breakdown or an emergency students must be dressed appropriately. Finally, have students stand well back away from the road while waiting for the bus for their safety and the safety of those already on the bus.

In addition to our automated call system, announcements on closures or delays will be posted on our school's web page, our GCS App, Twitter, and the district's Facebook page. The GCS app is free to download; search for Greene Central School District (all four words) in your app store. Please check these first, as some media outlets no longer accept closings and delays because most districts utilize their call system and web page. We will continue to provide snow closing information to area radio and television stations.

In the Event of a Delay

- A. BOCES Occupation School Students—In the event of a two-hour delay in opening, morning BOCES students will not be sent to the area center. They will stay at the High School campus.
- B. Students attending any special class or parochial school will be transported to their respective schools, but with a two-hour delay in arrival time.
- It is important to continue to watch and listen for updates!

Early Dismissals

In the event of a forecast that indicates approaching weather that may cause hazardous driving conditions, we may have an early dismissal. In this event, our automated calling system, our school app, our web page, Twitter, Facebook page, and news stations will be updated. We urge parents to alert caregivers of this possibility to ensure that younger children are not left at home unsupervised. Parents of elementary children, please contact the school at your earliest convenience with babysitter information, so that students are loaded properly on their bus in the event of an early dismissal.

Tips to Help Your Special Education Student Find Success in School

At the Greene Central School District, we offer many different special education supports for our students both in district and out of district. Our committee on special education, which includes the parent, makes determinations in the best interest of children throughout the school year. You may be wondering how you as a parent can help support your learner best though. Here are five tips to consider!

- 1. Communicate with their teachers. Special education should be a team approach and supporting your child's learning at home starts with knowing what they are doing in school. Talk to their teacher about their Individual Education Plan (IEP) and what you can be doing to help your child reach their goals. Take advantage of parent teacher conferences along with the communication method used in your child's classroom be it Seesaw, Google Classroom, email, or others. Showing your child that you and the teacher are on the same page can go a long way in finding success in the school day.
- 2. Spend time together. While as a school district we understand the importance of academics, there is so much more to creating a well-rounded child. Social and emotional growth are also important. Take time to have fun, relax, and take outings together. Getting involved in out of school activities is an amazing opportunity for all children, not just special education students, to interact with their peers, and Greene offers opportunities for everyone from sports to scouts!
- 3. Focus on their victories. Often we unintentionally focus on students with disabilities shortcomings. Try focusing on what your child is doing well. Have a conversation every day about what they are learning in school and what they are enjoying. Be sure to congratulate them on new accomplishments, such as moving forward a reading level or trying something new.
- 4. Be open and listen. Your child might have questions or concerns about their special needs or about life in general. When they speak up about something, be sure to listen. If they ask questions about their disability, be open and positive in your response. Remember, everyone has something that makes them special.
- 5. Show your full support. No matter what level of need your child has, you are their biggest supporter, and they look to you to build their confidence in themselves.

Raising a child with a disability comes with a unique responsibility. While your child is being nurtured in school, parents extend this nurturing environment into the home and create an encompassing environment that gives children all the tools they need to develop to their highest potential.

From the School Resource Officer



Dear GCS Students and Families,

On October 3rd of this year I started as the second School Resource Officer for the Greene Central School District. The Primary and Intermediate schools will be the main buildings that I will be responsible for, but will certainly spend time in the Middle and High School to become familiar with the entire school district, students and staff. My position as the SRO is to be an extension of the school administration and staff to create a safe and positive learning/teaching environment for students and teachers. I am truly happy to be working with the students, teachers and all the staff here at Greene Central Schools.

I have a 25-year background in law enforcement within the corrections division at the Broome County Sheriff's Office. I began my career as a corrections officer and then became

an intelligence officer for the Sheriff's Office, where I was eventually promoted to Sergeant. As a Corrections Officer, I was a member of the Sheriff's Emergency Response Team for the Correctional Facility. My time as an Intelligence Officer was spent gathering information, through interviews and interrogations, and disseminating the pertinent information/intelligence to the appropriate department or agency. I am a NYS certified instructor for NYS General Topics, Use of Force, Firearms, Impact Weapons, and NYS DOJ Reality-Based Training. I have also attended the following additional training: Tactical Debriefing for Field Intelligence Officers, Interview and Interrogation, FBI Basic Crisis Negotiation and NYSIC Field Intelligence Officer. In the near future, I will be attending training with the National Association of School Resource Officers, to become a nationally certified SRO.

My personal philosophy is to take every day as a day to learn something new and try to pass that learning on to others. I am thankful to all for the warm and welcome reactions from the students, teachers and staff that I have met so far with many more to meet.
