

POLICY 37A**Parents' Bill of Rights for Data Privacy and Security**

Pursuant to Education Law §2-d, school districts are now required to publish, on their websites, a parent bill of rights for data privacy and security and to include such information with every contract a school district enters into with a third party contractor where the third party contractor receives student data or teacher or principal data. The following is our District's bill of rights for data privacy and security:

1. A student's personally identifiable information (PII) cannot be sold or released by Greene Central School District for commercial or marketing purposes.
2. Parents have the right to inspect and review the complete contents of their child's education record including any student data stored or maintained by the District/BOCES. This right of inspection is consistent with the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). In addition to the right of inspection of the educational record, Education Law 2-d provides right for parents to inspect or receive copies of any data in the student's education record. The New State Department of Education (NYSED) will develop policies and procedures pertaining to this right.
3. State and federal laws protect the confidentiality of PII, and safeguards associated with industry standards and best practices, including, but not limited to, encryption, firewalls, and password protection, must be in place when data is stored or transferred.

5. Parents have the right to file complaints with the District/BOCES about possible privacy breaches of student data by the District's/BOCES' third party contractors or their employees, officers, or assignees, or with NYSED. For purposes of further ensuring confidentiality and security of student data, as an appendix to the Parent's Bill of Rights each contract an educational agency enters into with a third party contractor shall include the following supplemental information:

1. The exclusive purposes for which the student data, or teacher or principal data, will be used;

2. How the third party contractor will ensure that the subcontractors, persons or entities that the third party contractor will share the student data or teacher or principal data with, if any, will abide by data protection and security requirements;
3. When the agreement with the third party contractor expires and what happens to the student data or teacher or principal data upon expiration of the agreement;
4. If and how a parent, student, eligible student, teacher or principal may challenge the accuracy of the student data or teacher or principal data that is collected; and
5. Where the student data or teacher or principal data will be stored (describe in such a manner as to protect data security), and the security protections taken to ensure such data will be protected, including whether such data will be encrypted. In addition, the Chief Privacy Officer, with input from parents and other education and expert stakeholders, is required to develop additional elements of the Parents' Bill of Rights to be prescribed in the Regulations of the Commissioner.

Accordingly, this Bill of Rights will be revised from time to time in accordance with further guidance received from the Chief Privacy Officer, the Commissioner of Education and NYSED.

POLICY #84
Sidewalks

As Greene Central School owns sections of sidewalk including that on County Road 32 leading to the elementary schools, certain guidelines are in place for residents along said sections.

No person shall, without written permission from Greene Central School, construct, dig, remove, repair, or replace any sidewalk or curbing within the area owned and maintained by Greene Central School.

Any person making excavation on County Road 32 or any other sidewalk area owned by the District, shall be required to restore such sidewalk to its original condition.

No person or persons shall undermine any sidewalk, driveway, lot, lawn, or entry-way owned by Greene Central School.

POLICY #85

Display of the Flag

A United States flag shall be displayed in front of every building in the District every day that school is in session and at such other times as the Superintendent shall direct. Unless otherwise stated, the flags shall be flown at full-staff.

In addition to days when the school is in session, the flags will be displayed on the following days: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Lincoln's Birthday, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Flag Day, the Fourth of July, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Pearl Harbor Day and Christmas Day. If any of these days (except Flag Day) falls on a Sunday, the flag shall be displayed on the next day. In addition, the flag shall be displayed on each general election day and each day appointed by the President of the United States or by the Governor of New York as a general thanksgiving or for displaying the flag. Flags shall be flown at half-staff on Pearl Harbor day, on days commemorating the death of a personage of great importance, and on days designated by the President of the United States or the Governor of New York State.

The flags shall fly at half-staff to commemorate the death of a present or former Board member, student or district staff member. Flags shall be flown at half-staff for five school days in these instances, or as directed by the President of the United States or the Governor of New York State.

The flag will not be displayed on days when the weather is inclement. Any United States flags displayed indoors shall be the responsibility of the person in charge of the room where the flag is displayed. Flags shall be displayed in a respectful manner at all times.
